Ms. *Routledge* presented the Report of the Select Standing Committee on Finance and Government Services, Interim Report on Statutory Offices, for the Second Session of the Forty-second Parliament (First), August 2021.

The Report was taken as read and received.

By leave, Ms. *Routledge* moved that the Report be adopted.

A debate arose.
